Lesson Focus/Teaching Point: Management Lesson – Choosing Books - Book Frenzy

[Book Talk]		
Mini-Lesson	Introduction	 Yesterday we looked at our classroom library and saw how it was organized. We thought about how to handle our books and take care of this library so that we'll have great books to read all year. Today I want to teach you that readers can look at books, read a little, think about it, and then decide what they want to read.
	Teaching & Active Engagement	 We want our reading time to be fun so let's pick books that will keep us interested. We're going to do a book frenzy today. That means we'll look at several books very quickly and find some good ones. So what can you do with the book to help you decide if you want it? Possible responses: Look at pictures See table of contents Read the back Do a book walk Read the first page Look at the cover See how it makes you feel Let me show you how we'll do this I'll start with a small pile of 2 books. Next, I look at it and think about if I'd like to read the book (model with think aloud) When I hear the signal, I'll hold on to it if I want to read it. I pass it along if I don't want to read it. You can only hold on to one per round. Did you see how I quickly looked at each book, read a little, thought about it, and then made a choice? Now you try it. You'll each start with 2 books, you'll look, read a little, think, and make your choice. (Give everyone two books from the box in the middle of the circle. Do a few rounds) Share – who chose a book that looks good? Share title and why you chose it. Chart (grades 3-6)– Ways we Choose Books*
	Connect to Independent Practice	 So today and every day when you pick books for your reading time, you can think about these things to make sure you have a book you'll like. Now, let's enjoy some reading time and get started with one of the books you chose!
